She informed the meeting that at a deputation with the Commissioners the fishermen had stated that there were good prospects for Balbriggan Harbour, provided the necessary work was carried out. Following this meeting a joint deputation of Balbriggan Town Commissioners and local fishermen was received by the Minister of State for Fisheries.

The chairman then appealed to the North County Representatives to help by ensuring that the Harbour was repaired. She stated that if a factory with a similar workforce was in danger of collapsing that a substantial amount of financial aid would be forthcoming.

Deputy Burke thanked Balbriggan Town Commissioners for inviting him. He felt it was a good step to have called such a meeting. He then read a reply he had received to a Dail question outlining the attitude of the Department of Fisheries and Forestery to Balbriggan Harbour. The Deputy then stated that in his opinion the Dublin Port & Docks Board had a statutory duty to maintain Balbriggan Harbour. He proposed that the Commissioners and the other North County Representatives should request a meeting with the members of the Board to impress on them their duty. He would also be putting down more questions in the Dail.

Councillor Gallagher stated that it was not financially possible for the County Council to take over Balbriggan Harbour as had been suggested. The expenditure involved would be out of all proportion to the Councils overall budget. He agreed with Deputy Burke's proposal concerning a joint deputation to the Dublin Port & Docks Board. Sufficient money would have to be made available by the Board to put the harbour in a proper state of repair.

Councillor Boland stated that a balance was made in drawing up the Act which was that the Main Port was meant to assist the small ports. If the Harbour was to be handed over to another agency it should be put in a proper state of repair first. He agreed with the proposal for a joint deputation. He also thought that possibly a new harbour authority could be set up with responsibility for the Harbour at Balbriggan and also Skerries, Rush and Lusk.

Councillor Ryan stated that although he was only a new member of Dublin County Council he was aware of the situation. Large sums of money were involved and Dublin Port and Docks Board had the responsibility to make them available. He agreed with the joint deputations to the Board to ensure the remedial work was carried out. At that stage the long term situation could be examined.

 Meeting with Swords Electoral Area Members of Dublin County Council to discuss Balbriggan Harbour.

At the outset the Chairman welcomed Councillors' Boland, Gallagher and and Ryan and thanked them for coming.

Councillor Boland read the following minutes of the meeting which the Councillors' had had with Dublin Port and Docks Board on 7th March, 1984.

Minutes of Special Meeting of North County District Committee, held on

7th March, 1984 with Representatives of Dublin Port and Docks Board:

BALBRIGGAN HARBOUR

At the outset, the Chairman welcomed the representatives from the Dublin Port and Docks Board.

The Chairman outlined the purpose of the meeting as being the need to prepare a submission through a joint approach, which would be presented to the relevant Government Ministers in order to seek their assistance in securing funds to rehabilitate Balbriggan Harbour.

The representatives of the Board reiterated the Board's stated policy in relation to its out-harbours, including Balbriggan i.e. that no monies over and above that required for the safety of life and limb would be expended. Revenue derived from commercial shipping in the Port of Dublin, which is currently operating at a loss, could not be expended to provide fishing facilities at Balbriggan; major repairs on development works would have to be funded on the same basis as other fisheries harbours i.e. 100% grant.

They outlined the major problems relating to the Harbour as follows:-

- (1) The structure of the shelter walls is very old and sections are liable to be washed away when storms, gales etc., occur.
- (2) Silting in the harbour has been kept at bay in the last few years by larger ships which scour the bottom and draw away the silt. However, the Harbour was never designed for the larger ships which are now using it. These ships are undermining the quay wall and have already been banned from one section of the Harbour.

The costs involved in carrying out improvements has not been estimated but would certainly be in excess of £1 million.

It was agreed to seek a meeting with the relevant Ministers and the representatives from the Dublin Port and Docks Board indicated their willingness to carry out the necessary works, if a 100% grant is made available by Central Government.

The meeting concluded at 10.40 a.m.

The Commissioners stated that they had been waiting since June, 1983 for 4 a full meeting with all interested parties and they rejected the claims made by Dublin Port & Docks Board concerning the large boats. They stressed the need to persue the jobs dependent on the fishing industry in the Town.

The Members of Dublin County Council stated that they appreciated the potential of the industry for the Town but it was a time for being realistic. The money was not going to come from the Dublin Port & Docks Board or Dublin County Council because of the large amount involved. The approach must be made to Central Government and a proper submission must be prepared.

Following further discussion, it was agreed to:

- (1). Ask Dublin Port & Docks Board to prepare plans and specifications with costings for the repair of Balbriggan Harbour.
- (2). Approach An Taoiseach and the Government Ministers involved asking for the Commissioners to be involved in any meetings.
- (3). Prepare a submission for Central Government concerning, among other matters, the size of the fishermans investment and the effect the collapse of the fishing industry would have on Balbriggan.

The Chairman, again, thanked the Council Members for attending and they then left the meeting.



It was further agreed that a separate file of correspondence requested at meetings, be kept to facilitate ease of reference where necessary.
- (b) Concern was expressed by the members at the execution of road repairs at Chapel Street corner. It was agreed to request the Manager to have the matter investigated.

3. MATTERS ARISING OUT OF DEPUTATIONS MEETING HELD ON 21/3/85:

Discussion on sewerage system and outfall

It was stated that this had been discussed at length since 1979, and to date had not been satisfactorily resolved, and it was indicated that in the event of a power failure at the harbour, a serious overflow would occur after 20 minutes. It was proposed and seconded that the area T.D.'s and Councillors, together with the Chairman of the North District be invited to a meeting with the Commissioners to be held in the Town Hall on Wednesday, 24th April, 1985, at 8.30 p.m. It was further resolved that a letter be issued to Residents Associations indicating positions as at March, 1980, and April, 1985.

Piping of river at Bremore and Lambeecher Housing Estates

The Commissioners indicated that having regard to the condition of the river it was imperative that this river be piped. They expressed surprise at the estimate given by Engineering staff and requested that they receive a breakdown of same. They also requested a site meeting with the responsible Engineer so as further outline their case.

Removal of "No Football" sign at Chapel Court open space

It was noted that the sign was not yet removed and it was agreed that a letter would be sent to the appropriate Department of the County Council in relation to this matter.

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Present position and time scale for Balbriggan By-Pass

The site was full of pot-holes, it was being used as a toilet, and there was a fear that travellers would settle on the site, as they had tried to do in the past. ITEM 4 Stream adjacent to the Estate

The Chairman Commissioner Kennedy presided.

Commissioner outlined the position concerning the convening of the meeting and stated that the purpose of the meeting was to hear any objections there might be to the proposed one way system. The Town Clerk then gave a brief outline of events leading to the present proposals and then gave a detail of them. The Chairman then opened the meeting to the floor. Paul Coughlan of High Street stated that the problem had been caused by the Shopping Centre, which had initially been supplied with a delivery slope close to the High St. entrance and this was not been used. If High St. was designated as a one-way in an up hill direction this would work against the residents of the area. Mrs. Devant of High St. asked whether the residents had any rights in the matter and having been assured that all comments would be forwarded to the appropriate authorities, she stated that the one-way system was, as it referred to High St was not a solution as there were more problems associated with traffic turning into Quay St. Mrs Bannon then reiterated her complaints as per her letters already forwarded to the Commissioners on the County Council. Mr. P'McArdle of High St. wanted to know what would happen in the event of a fire and if the one-way system would hinder the emergency services. The Chairman stated that the emergency services have exemption and are intitalled to go to the quickest way to the fire. Mrs. Mary White of High St. stated that the last time High St. residents objected to a particular proposal in the street that they were well beaten from all sources .. John McGowan of the Cardy Marina, Stated that he was neutral at the moment with regard to the proposals but if there were any changes he would have to reassess his position. Mrs. B. McAuleyof High St. whether the Council council were aware that telephone cables were been torn down by high trucks in High St. and she 185

gave an example of Mr Mc Ardle's telephone line which had been left broken for a forthnight. Mr. E. White asked if a traffic survey had been carried out and if so where were the figures. He also stated that if the town was to be by-passed shortly this would make the oneway system obsolete. John Gallan of Hampton St. who has a business premises in Mill St said that he was strongly in favour of the proposals but they would have to be tied in with strong enforcement of no-parking in the Town. He stated the bye-pass would not have any effect on the traffic problem within Balbriggan, as most was caused by residents of the town. Edmond Madeck of Balscadden wanted to know why the proposals were put forward in respect of Clonard St. and Chapel St, as this would have the effect of causing a back log of traffic in the town when cars were attempting to turn into Clonard St. Tom McCabe of Clonard ST. asked that if the traffic were to be diverted up Clonard St. would all the traffic go through Fulham St. which at present is a quiet residential area. Paul Coughlan of High St. Suggested that instead of implementing the system could Quay St. not be kept clear. Ciaran Geraghty of Hampton Cove with premises in Railway St. stated that it was trucks that were holding up traffic in Quay St. and asked why the parking bay in High St. was not been used. He suggested that the if the law was strictly enforced for one week it would make a difference. Jack McGuinness of Quay St. said that there should be an access directly to the carpark across the river from Quay St. He also stated that parking tickets only drove customers away. The traders were neither for or against the present proposals. Des Darragh of High St. again asked what rights the residents had, he stated that Hampton ST. and Clonard St. were effected by the proposals and these were not surfaced properly at present. If there were to be a one-way system he would prefer to see High St. one-way in the direction of Quay St. P.J. Mc Donnell, Business premises on the Square asked could there be a show of hands on the present proposals. The Chairman stated that the meeting was there to listen to objections and a show of hands would serve no useful purpose. Mary White stated that she would be against the proposals to go one-way down High St. as it would effect her reaching her business premises. The Chairman stated that there was an alternative proposal, to go down High St. to have parking on one side only. Mrs. Devan stated that they were told that when the Supermarket opened that it would improve the traffic problems, it in effect worsened them. Commissioner Davis stated that a major point had been The one-way system had to be taken into context with the whole town and not just a part of it . People of Balbriggan are guilty

parking everywhere and the main point been missed was the right of the predestrian, who cannot go through the town to shop in peace with illegal parking on footpaths and on corners. The proposal has to be looked at general, the one-way system was needed for the sake of everyone and fhey could not get caught up in sectional interests. People have the right of opinon and he was also getting pressure from people who had to go out with prams to walk around the town. Something had to be done about the traffic flow and parking. Commissioner Tuite stated that the problem and the blame lay with the Shopping Centre. She asked why Mr McAuley was not present and why the County Council Road Planners were not at the meeting. Mr. McFadden wanted to know why no meeting was called when the supermarket was opened. Oliver Heeney, Chief Fire Officer, Balbriggan, stated that the situation regarding the Fire Brigade in Balbriggan was that on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, it was impossible to bring a fire engine down Quay St. ar up the Square. The one-way system in Chapel St./Clonard St. area would delay the turnout of the fire engine by about four minutes. He was in agreement with the one-way system, However, the strict enforcement of parking regulations. Commissioner Larkin stated that at this stage there was nothing they could do about the supermarket and they were here to discuss the present proposals voting on the issue was not the right way to go about. Mrs. Browne of Pinewood stated that as a pedrestrian she cannot cross the road safely due to parking on both sides of the road. She asked that traffic regulations be strictly enforced. Mr. Madeck, Balscadden, stated that the supermarket was the best thing that every happened to the town. The yellow lines were been completely ignored and traffic wardens were needed in the town. He also stated that the Garda should issue tickets to the truck drivers and that all parking restrictions should be strictly enforced. Karen Geraghty asked could they have a view from the Garda and the Chairman stated that this would be forwarded to them presently. Paul Coughlan of High St. asked had the planners looked to the future when they had given permission to the Shopping Centre, and if they had they would have seen the problems that would have occured. Commissioner Purcell stated that to go up Clonard St. the road at the Grave yard would have to be widened, to allow traffic to go up it and to prevent heavy traffic going into Fulham St. There is a problem turning down into Quay St. due to the illegal parking and measure should be introduced to force people to use the carpark.

Bernie White business premises in the Square, stated if all the parking restrictions were enforced and the one-way system was brought into operation, the Main St and Side St. would become a speed area. Mrs. White stated that there should be parking on one side of High St. only and this will allow a free flow of traffic. Commissioner Lawless, stated that motorists were 99% to blame for the traffic problems in the town and his opinon of the needed. P.J. MCDonnell, Business premises the Square, stated that prior to the Shopping Centre been opened a meeting of the traders had been held at which they decided to ask for a carpark to be built at the back of John D's on the Main St. This was not proceeded when the application for the Shopping Centre was submitted. Commissioners Davis said that he had a lot of reservations about the Shopping Centre, but that it has got its permission properly and it is a fact of life. He had also stated another family had imorfed the carpark in supplying land to it and Maurice Mc Auley. John McGowan of the Cardy Marina, stated that he had only been in the town a short while but in his opinon Maurice McAuley was the one man who has done more for the town than anybody else. Mary White stated on behalf of the High St. Residents that there consensus was that they did not want any one-way system. Denis Dye of the Harbour Inn, suggested that double yellow lines be put all along the Main Street and Quay St. and to put a bridge over the river for access to the main carpark from Quay St. and for adequate signs to be erected showing were the carpark is located. Superintendent Faughnan stated that he was there to serve the community at large, in his opinon the double yellow lines had worked quite well as a first attempt. The traffic was now flowing quite well in the town compared to other towns such as Drogheda. In his opinon something had to be done in the High St./Quay St. area, he had already suggested to the Town Commissioners that they employ a Traffic Warden. He wants noted that the fine for parking offences was now £10.00, he stated that there was a legal exempton for loading and unloading of lorries and if they issued a ticket it would be sufficient for the driver to go to court and state that he was loading/unloading and the prosecution would not be proceeded with. The Minister of the Environment, Mr. John Boland, T.D. welcomed the Commissioners and asked them to outline their case concerning the sewerage system in Balbriggan. Commissioner Gallen, then gave details of the background to the present meeting stating that the sewerage system is totally inadequate and despite lengthy correspondence and a number of deputations with Dublin County Council, no satisfaction had been received. Commissioner Gallen outlined the following points as been of particular concern:

- 1. Storm Water was going into the sewerage system at various places in the Town.
- 2. There were a number of grey areas in the Town where raw sewage was flowing directly into the harbour and the sea.
- 3. In the event of breakdowns, raw sewage flowed directly into the sea.
- 4. The present system for the town was not adequate, as it had been built to cater for a population of 2,000. It was now servicing eight to ten thousand.
- 5. Raw sewage is regularly seen on the beaches.
- 6. The system was built to pump on the ebb tide, it was now pumping into the sea 24 hours a day.
- 7. Dublin County Council have suggested to extend the outflow pipe, this certainly would not help the situation.
- 8. Various counts from biological sampling by the Eastern Health Board and Dublin County Council were erratic.

The County Manager, stated that he was there in support of the Commissioners and he stated that a lot of representations had been received from the Commissioners, Councillors and other interested bodies. The County Council were continuing on-going monitoring of the beaches and the Dublin Medical Officer said that the beaches particularty the one beside the Bower were safe. It was now necessary to examine the

situation and flow testing and bed testing will be starting week ending 11th July, 1986. He was not in a position to forcast the outcome of the tests at this stage. Commissioner Murray, stated that they were only now getting response from the Council and they were looking for a treatment plant. The Minister informed the deputation that he could only sanction a proposal if it was put in front of him. Personally, he does not agree with the County Council, and he suggested that the Commissioners should talk again with the Manager and the County Council. Commissioner Gallen stated that guidelines were been breached occassionally. The Minister stated that the Commissioners should insist that the County Council back at Gormanstown Camp, Balbriggan, Skerries and waters in between. Again he stated that on a personal basis, he was not satisfied with the situation. The Manager stated that the County Council would have to report to the Minister with facts and figures before a presentation could be brought to the Minister. The Minister then stated that if he got a proposal for a sewage treatment plant which was reasonable, he would sanction it in the shortest possible time. Commissioner Gallen, then asked the Minister if he could get the Dublin Bay Water Quality Survey extended to Balbriggan. The Minister stated that this would probably go on for some length of time and felt something more immediate should be done. The Minister then stated that he was totally unhappy with the attitude of Dublin County Council and was surprised at the Commissioners not being more forceful in the situation.

The Chairman, Commissioner Lawless presided.

The Chairman welcomed Mr. Garvan to the meeting and thanked him for coming the Chairman then outlined the situation regarding unemployment in Balbriggan and the total lack of any industry setting up in the town. He gave examples of two cases of local people who would be willing to set up in Balbriggan, if accommodation was available and he asked Mr. Garvan if the I.D.A. could build some advance factories in the area. Mr. Garvan stated that the role of the I.D.A. was to provide manufacturing industry and to support medium and small industries and also to support existing Irish Industry. They were at present putting large effort into starting up small industries and they had a permanent staff of 35 to co-ordinate this. In 1982, they purchased land at Bremore, Balbriggan and in 1983 they applied for planning permission for five incubator units at Stephenstown. To date, they have been unsuccessful in attracting an industry to the site at Bremore and in accordance with current industrial policy they have been instructed not to build anymore factories, until their current level had been reduced significantly. This had now been reduced by more than half in the previous two years and they hoped to have another significant decrease in the current year. He also stated that the I.D.A. had seen no demand for factory space from Balbriggan and no entreprenerial spirit appeared to be emanating from Balbriggan and there was alot of competition for industrial development from both Ireland and Euripean Countries. The Commissioners impressed on Mr. Garvan that Balbriggan was an excellent location as the I.D.A. had themselves admitted and what the Commissioners wanted were buildings on the site at Stephenstown which could then be sold or rented to suitable manufacturers. Balbriggan had a record of industrial employment going back over hundreds of years and no jobs were lost in the town due to

industrial action. The Commissioners then asked if the I.D.A. had stopped building factories, why was there one built in Arklow? Mr. Garvan stated that Balbriggan was squeezed between Drogheda and Swords and alot of people were employed in both these areas from Balbriggan. Small industry in the town would help but large foreign industry was also needed. In relation to the Arklow factory, this was the only exception in the past 3 years to the general policy of not building. This was done because out of a population of eight and half thousand they had lost thirteen hundred and fifty manufacturing jobs in the last number of years and the scale was quite dramatic. He then stated that the commissioners should use all means at their disposal to try and get some advance factories built. In answer to a query from the Commissioners concerning how the town was actually promoted, Mr. Garvan replied that small industry was normally the result of entreprenerial spirit within the town where individuals or groups came forward with ideas, and the I.D.A. helped them as much as possible. From their own end they advertised their availability, they had a walk-in centre in Dublin and also an enterprise œntre in Pearse Street and on request they would come out to meet community groups in the area. In addition feasibility grants of up to 50% of costs were available from the I.D.A. and they also gave research and development grants. The Commissioners then re-iterated the fact that they felt that the buildings must be there in order to attract people to the town and asked Mr. Garvan to investigate the matter. Mr. Garvan promised that he would discuss the matter with his manager and he also stated that where buildings were put up by private individuals for manufacturing industry, in some cases the I.D.A. might be able to guarantee up to 25% of the rent for five years, but there must be community involvement in the project. The Chairman then thanked Mr. Garvan for coming to the meeting and thanked

The Chairman, Commissioner Lawless, presided.

The Chairman welcomed the Manpower representatives and explained that the Commissioners felt there was a need for a Manpower Office in Balbriggan even if only for one half-day each week. He gave the following figures for persons unemployed in Balbriggan: Men - 267, Boys - 68, Women - 85, Girls - 42 a total of 462. In addition, the Chairman stated there was a total of 1,541 people in the general area who were registered with the Balbriggan Office, Other Commissioners agreed, and supported the Chairmans comments and asked if the Manpower representatives could give details, with figures of the work they were doing. Mr. Chaney stated, as an example, that when the Social Employment Scheme was introduced they attended in Balbriggan Employment Exchange having interviewed everybody there were only 23 eligible people from Balbriggan and 42 from Skerries. He then went on to give details of all aspects of Manpower activities in the North County Area. Following lengthy discussion it was agreed that Manpower representatives would make a recommendation to their headoffice that an office be opened on a part-time basis in Balbriggan, for a trial period. It was also agreed that the Balbriggan Town Commissioners would adopt a resolution along these lines and forward it to the appropriate Minister.

Candons, the winner in the section for Traditional Shop Fronts is an example of how small shops around the town could improve their appearence without major alterations.

Hanley & Co. winners a few years ago and well maintained since, show what could be done when major reconstruction is undertaken. Tasteful design not only enhance the shop concerned, but also the whole street.

C. Corr also has made a vast improvement since last year by having the existing facia repainted in a traditional manner. However, a better arrangement of hardware on the outside would help things further.

On the modern section, Tony Murphy's Jewellers, (Winner), Cronins Pharmacy and Brian McConville are fine examples of modern design and tasteful window dressing. Unfortunately, in this section not too many came near the standar set by the first three. In general, there are still too many gaudy plastic signs, too many posters and in some cases too little paint.

Lets hope that next year brings a further improvement. In the section for the Best Housing Estate, it must be said that this is not the best time of year for judging this competition. However, that been said, Clonard Court came out in front. Its a tidy and pleasant estate to walk through and should improve further over the years as gardens and trees mature.

St. Pauls Crescent, is a pleasant little estate with well kept gardens and houses, the only sour note been, the amount of dead leaves allowed to build up in corners.

Hampton Cove Last Years winner, has slipped a little since last year, but still a nice estate. Grass verges were left uncut in places and some gardens has wind damaged shrubs and trees which spoiled the overall look of the place.
